From the Coaches:

Kyneton: We had a three year plan and we didn't mind where we were we were going to do our best to win a final. RDFNL has been a good fit and we are looking forward to once last challenge. Hopefully we can finish this season with a win and make it 10-0. They have some real play makers who set them up well in Lilli Collins and Lulu Slater but both teams are number one and number 2 for the season in contested possessions so it should be a great game. It has been an extraordinary season for the Tigers in the RDFNL.

Coming across from the Bendigo Football League Kyneton have dominated with bigger senior bodies and more experience every week.

They have been polished from start to finish and recorded an undefeated season.

The season was returned a perfect record for the Tigers minus the round five abandoned game with Melton which meant they shared the points on one occasion.

Tigers control the play and stifle the opposition as they try to surge the ball forward.

They will go into the grand final as favourites and rightly so.

Each week we have experienced new players putting their hand up with incredible stat lines and the consistency of their top performances have been incredible.

During the year Belinda Hateley, Alexandra Strawhorn and the captain Teagan Ainslie have all been recognized as the Premier Data player of the week and there could have been a whole lot more.

Heidi Erasmus has been very consistent throughout the season, Tayla Moore is another tough match up and Jordan Savoia saved her best football for the second half of the season.

The Tigers have made it near impossible to score allowing their opposition over the 10-week home and away season just 17 scoring opportunities to their 191.

Outside of the abandoned match, in incredible fog Woodend Hesket got within 17 points of Kyneton.

Their biggest win came in round one against Romsey. Kyneton defeated the inexperienced Redbacks by 121 points.

Tamara Collins continued to drive the program and despite being the last team to enter the Senior Women's competition they had made a start.

As the season went on numbers begin to grow, their own scores grew with it and their ability to stop teams from scoring big also started to take shape.

We have always known they have the star power with Lulu Slater and Lilli Collins but were they going to have enough depth to help get the four points.

During the year they were held scoreless on three occasions but they didn't lose hope.

It was a tough finish to the season for Woodend Hesket.

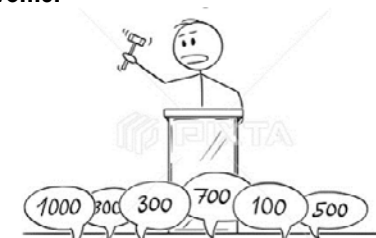

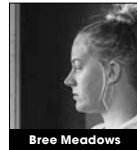

GRACE: How excited is the group to be playing in a grand final?


