Seniors Presentation

Drawn Football Finals

In the event of a drawn game in any Finals match (including the Senior Football Grand Final), the following shall apply:

- The teams will change ends following a break of no more than three minutes.
- A five-minute quarter will be played (including timeon) before immediately changing ends for another five minute quarter (including time-on). There is to be no break between these quarters.
- If at the end of the second five-minute quarter scores are still level, no change of ends will occur, play will be restarted at the centre bounce and the first score will win.

NOTE: Extra time will commence as soon as goal umpires have ascertained the scores are correct, and umpires are ready. The players must not leave the ground, coaches may address the players prior to the commencement of extra time, however teams are to change ends at the completion of the first five (5) minutes.

Drawn Netball Finals

- (i) There is a four (4) minute time allowance to enable teams to change ends and scores will be verified on the official scoresheet
- (ii Positional changes and substitutions may be made during changeover time.
- (iii) The extra time is as follows:

GRADE EXTRA TIME A Grade 2 x 7 Minutes **B** Grade 2 x 6 Minutes C Grade & 19&U, All Juniors 2 x 5 Minutes

- (iv) At the end of the first half there will be one (1) minute interval where substitutions again can be made. Teams change ends to begin the second half.
- (v) Should there still be a draw at the end of the second half of extra time. Play continues until one team has a 2 (two) goal advantage.

Diggers Rest vs Woodend Hesket

From the Coaches:

Players to watch

Woodend Hesket: Tayte Pears has defended on bigger stages than Romsey on grand final day. He is key for Woodend Hesket getting the football back in their possession.

Key Match Ups

Jaycob Hickey vs Daniel Toman: Both players have added some serious depth and fire power to their respective teams in 2023. Both players have great skills on the inside and can get out and run.

Mark Orr vs Tim Martin: These two big men have dominated in the middle of the ground for their teams in season 2023. They give their team first use of the football and get their hands on plenty of football around the ground. Both have outstanding skills but on a hot day their fitness will also come into question. Whoever gets on top in this match up will go a long way to being a premiership player.

Prediction: Diggers Rest to win by 14 points and Jaidyn Caruana to be best on ground.

Brad Cooke was injured during the year but is capable of turning and match and Lachlan Hay is a star of the future.


Edward Ferguson was named best on ground when the two teams met just two weeks ago.



Female Football



Wallan:




Woodend Hesket:
