Drawn Football Finals

In the event of a drawn game in any Finals match (including the Senior Football Grand Final), the following shall apply:

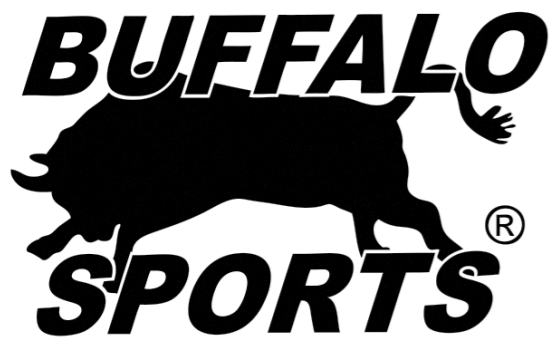
- The teams will change ends following a break of no more than three minutes.
- A five-minute quarter will be played (including time-on) before immediately changing ends for another five-minute quarter (including time-on). There is to be no break between these quarters.
- If at the end of the second five-minute quarter scores are still level, no change of ends will occur, play will be restarted at the centre bounce and the first score will win.

NOTE: Extra time will commence as soon as goal umpires have ascertained the scores are correct, and umpires are ready. The players must not leave the ground, coaches may address the players prior to the commencement of extra time, however teams are to immediately change ends at the completion of the first five (5) minutes.

Drawn Netball Finals

In the event of a draw, the following will apply;

- The teams will change ends following a break of four minutes. This allows scores to be verified.
- Teams will play two periods of extra time stopping for one minute in between to make changes and swap ends.
- The extra time periods is half a normal quarter. In the event of an odd number round down. (For example, 10 minutes quarters play 5 additional minutes each end. 15 minute quarters play 7 additional minutes each end.
- If at the end of two extra time periods the game is still level play continues until one team has a two goal advantage. The siren or horn does not sound.

From the Coaches

Riddell: We are really happy with where we are at. Finals are a different ball game but we are really confident in how we have been playing and what we have been doing so we won't be stuffing around with anything too drastic. We will be ready to adapt and move as we need but we don't change what has got us to a grand final and seen us play some really good football. There are always going to be a few nerves just in anticipation but we fully expect to come out raring to go on Sunday. The weather certainly impacted the semi so we are under no illusion it will be easy. No finals are easy to win especially not grand final in front of a big crowd. No doubt there will be some chess played early a few positional changes, I don't know if I am

any good at chess but we are going to find out aren't we?


Wallan: It was an interesting day in the Semi Final versus Riddell, as the conditions were extremely challenging. It was only six points the difference at three quarter time but to their credit, Riddell adjusted with the breeze in the last quarter and executed their opportunities. There will be a few changes going into the Grand Final and we have analysed to recent footage, data and match ups. We are ready to go. Riddell has been the team to beat all season. They obviously finished on top of the ladder and are well Coached by Skip Bray. They recruited heavily over the preseason and have good players across every line. However, I have absolute faith in our playing group and Coaching staff, to execute a game plan on Grand Final day.

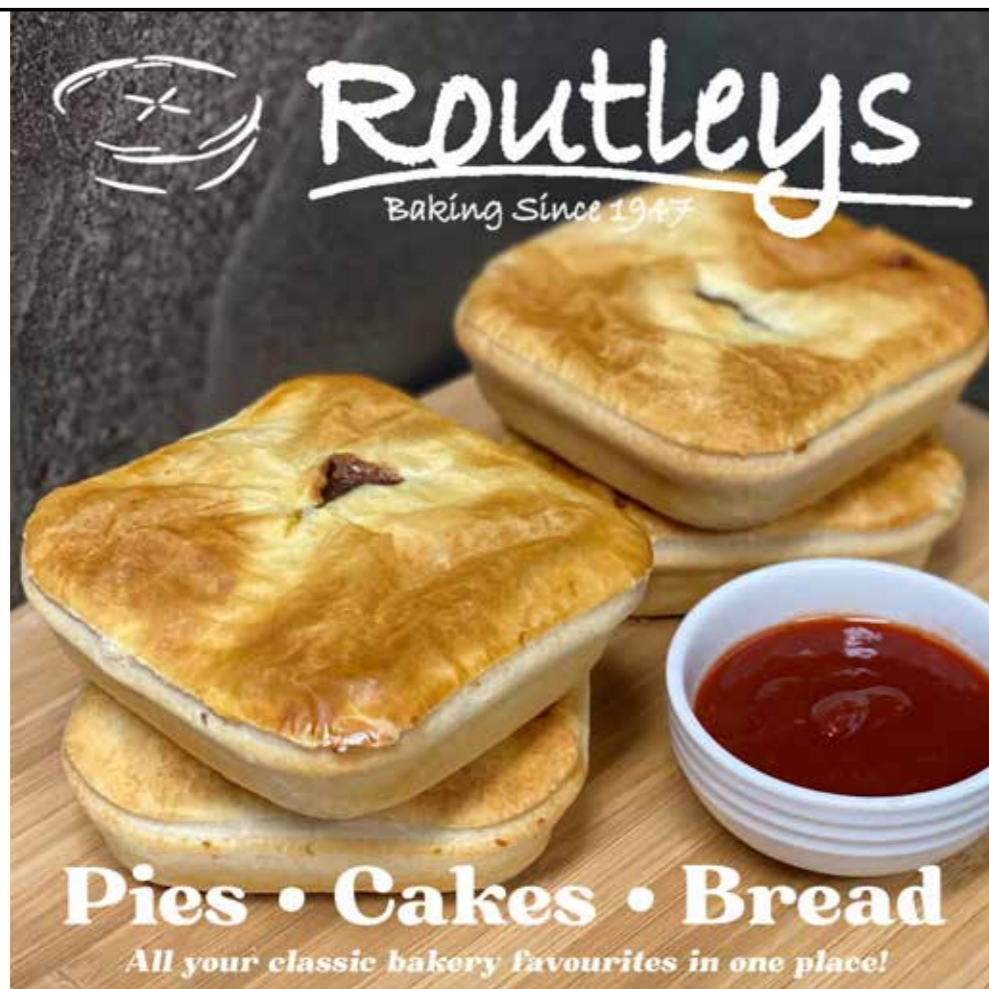

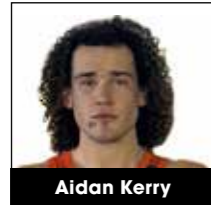

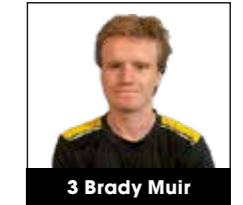

RDFNL Media Manager Grace Bibby sat down with Riddell Senior coach Arron Bray during the week to chat as they prepare for the grand final.

GRACE: How does it feel to have booked your spot in the senior Grade Final?

The RDFNL Season has almost come to a close so it would be remiss of me not to mention and thank a few very important people who have assisted and made RDFNL Netball Successful in 2024.

The first major hurdle for 2024 was the junior grading day.

For the first time in the RDFNL history the Junior Netball Grading took place on two day with a whopping 100 teams playing eight rounds.

There were 500 plus games played in great spirits and with the help of many club coordinators helping things to be as smooth as possible.

Grading once again showed a more even competition and a greater spread of clubs on grand final day.

While there were some teething issues, we were pleased to see by mid-way through the season the competition had settled.

The feedback the league has received since the early stages of the grading has been very positive and we are looking forward to the grading having even more impact in the coming seasons.

We also saw the RDFNL teams at Interleague level and more specifically at the Netball Victoria Association Championships and for the first time in a number of years we had a senior team selected to play against Southern FNL.

For the second time in as many seasons the RDFNL had teams in the finals and athletes identified for the state pathway.

The whole concept of RDFNL competing in the Association Championships is to open the state pathway and give our kids the best opportunity to become elite netballers.

This season it was a prerequisite of all interleague coaches to be qualified and we were very pleased with our coaches.

Thanks to Hope Hamilton, Naomi Klaasen and Tanae Bannam for their commitment to the program.

The 2025 interleague trails will be held in November with teams selected prior to Christmas.

This will give our coaches and players adequate amount of time to train as a group before the association championships take place in the middle of next year.

In the senior competition the point system is still creating a more even A grade competition. Lancefield showed they can match it with some of the stronger teams and Melton Centrals also improved significantly to play finals in the A grade.

Woodend Hesket and Riddell have recruited and retain players and will see the benefits of their efforts when they contest the 2024 A grade premiership this weekend.

The Hawks on-court success has been huge and now in 2024 their off court success will be even better as they wait for a facility upgrade.

Thanks also to every coordinator, coach and netballer that took part in season 2024.

We know it has been challenging at times but the positives far outweigh the negatives.

EMILY: It's what we set out to achieve from the moment I joined the club. The girls were disappointed to go down in overtime in the grand final last year, and all had the hunger to go one better in 2024. 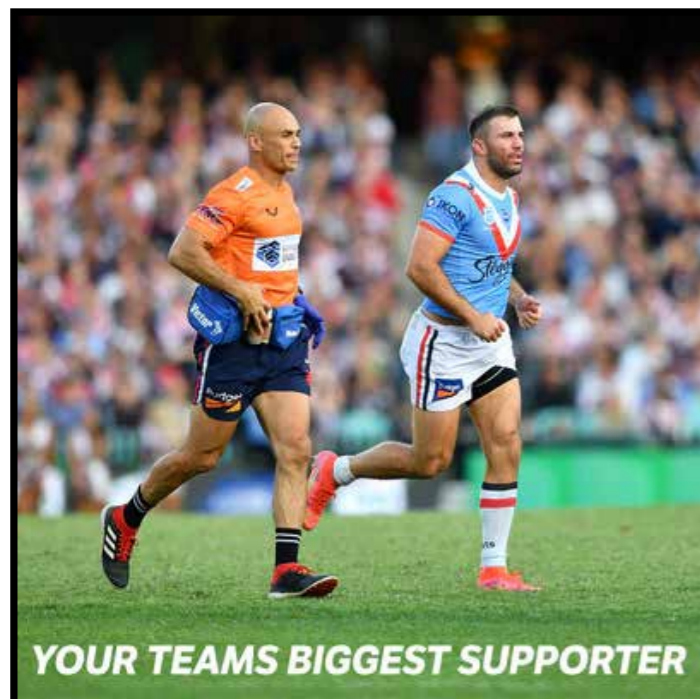

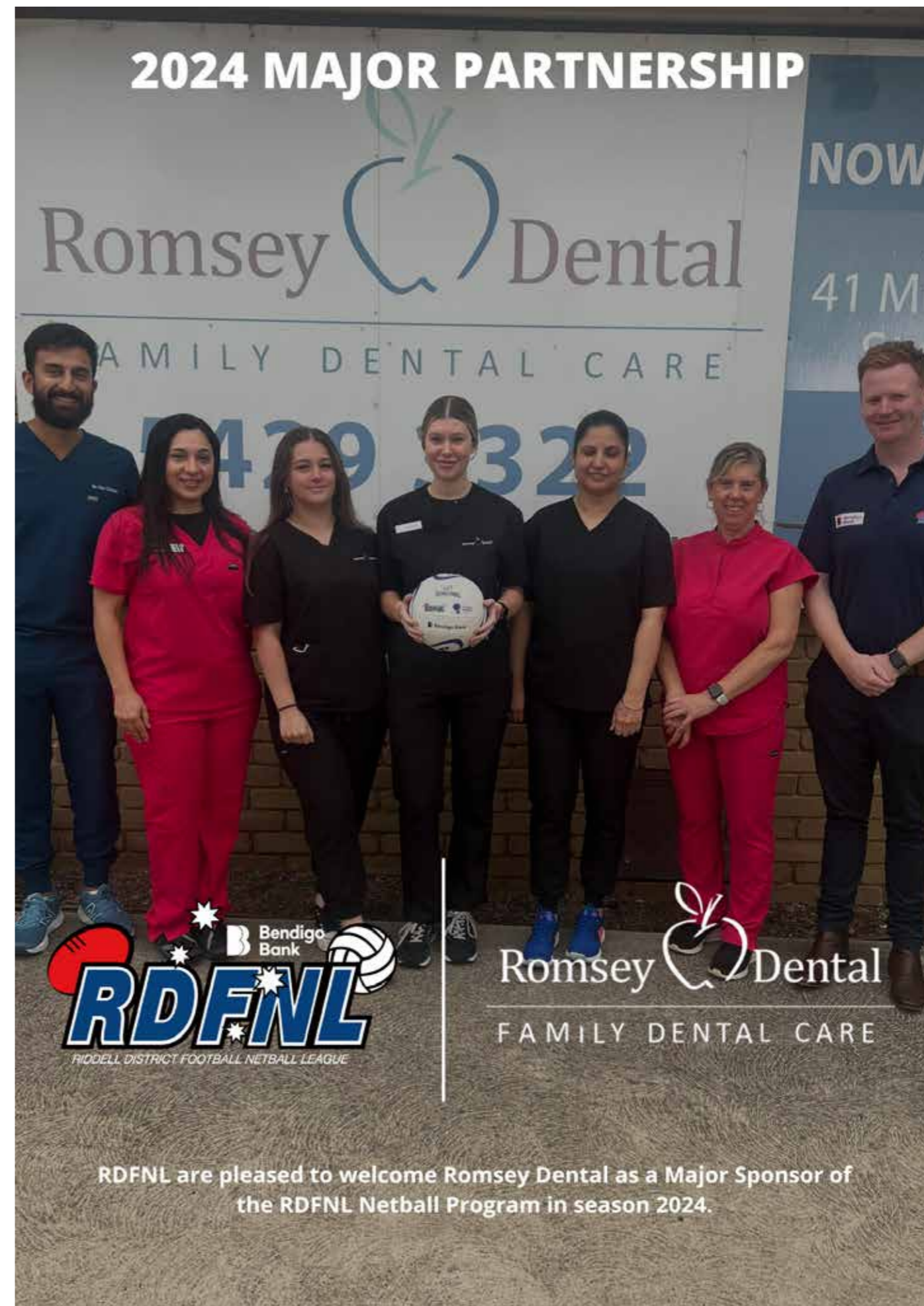
